

LANGUAGE PLACEMENT GUIDELINES

All SFS students must fulfill the SFS Foreign Language Proficiency as a graduation requirement. Preparation for this normally requires at minimum one course beyond the advanced (or 3rd) level and/or study abroad. SFS students are therefore required to be enrolled in a foreign language course every semester until proficiency is fulfilled.

Language placement, described by this section, has two purposes:

- to identify the appropriate level course for you to enroll in the fall
- to confirm AP and other credits (for transfer of college language courses from a previous institution)

Even if you are committed to one language and do not intend to take courses in some of the other languages you have studied before, we suggest that you still confirm placement in those other languages since you may decide to resume them later.

Students beginning a new language should enroll in the introductory course and need not take a placement test for that language.

Depending on the language, placement is by SAT II score, online test during the summer, on-campus proctored confirmation exam during New Student Orientation, and/or approximation by years/material of study. Read carefully the instructions specific to each of the languages that you will/may study at Georgetown, and for which you are seeking AP or other credits.

Tests for some of the languages are available online and should be taken during the summer prior to pre-registration.

The on-campus proctored confirmation exam given during New Student Orientation in late August is required for the following students.

- Students who seek credit for college language courses from a previous institution.

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- Students who seek AP credit for Spanish, unless they have taken the SAT II.
 - Students who seek AP credit for French, unless they have taken the SAT II.
 - Students who seek AP credit for German or who wish to continue in German at Georgetown. For German, both online (Part I) and on-campus (Parts II and III) tests are required. SAT II in German is not recognized for placement nor AP credit confirmation.
 - Students who seek AP credit for Latin or who wish to continue in Latin at Georgetown. SAT II in Latin is not recognized for AP credit confirmation.
 - Students who seek AP credit for Chinese or Japanese or who wish to continue in Chinese or Japanese at Georgetown.
 - Students who wish to continue in Italian who have not taken the SAT II.
 - Students who have studied Greek, Hebrew, Korean, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Turkish, or Ukrainian and who wish to continue in that language at Georgetown.

ARABIC

Students with no previous Arabic language coursework should register for:

ARAB 011 Intensive First Level Modern Standard Arabic I

All other students must take the online placement exam during the summer.

CHINESE

Students with no previous Mandarin Chinese coursework should register for:

CHIN 011 Intensive First Level Chinese I

Students with previous Mandarin Chinese experience who plan to continue with Chinese are required to take the preliminary online placement exam (Part I) during the summer and to follow the placement recommendations upon completion of the exam when preregistering for a Chinese class. To confirm placement, students **MUST** also take the on-campus proctored placement exam (Part II) during New Student Orientation in August.

Students seeking to receive transfer credit **MUST** take both the online exam (Part I) and a proctored confirmation exam (Part II, given on campus during New Student Orientation).

There are TWO versions of the Chinese placement exam:

- The **simplified Chinese Exam** is for those who read simplified characters.
- The **traditional Chinese Exam** is for those who read traditional characters.

FRENCH

Students with no previous French language coursework should preregister for either:

FREN-001 Introductory French I or
FREN-011 Intensive Basic French

Students who have studied French in the past are required to take the online placement exam during the summer and to follow the placement recommendations at the end of the exam. Even if you have taken the SAT II, the French department requires all students planning to enroll in a French course to take the online placement exam during the summer and to follow the placement recommendations at the conclusion of the exam. In the event that there is a discrepancy between the placement exam result and the SAT II placement, you should use the higher placement.

Students who do not have a qualifying SAT II score and who do not plan to continue with the language must [confirm their AP Credit](#) by taking the proctored confirmation exam during New Student Orientation.

Students who have taken the SAT II in French can determine their level by consulting the French department's "[Placement Scale](#)."

GERMAN

Students with no previous German language coursework should preregister for:

GERM 001 Introductory German I: Experiencing Germany or
GERM 011 Intensive Basic German: Experiencing Germany

Students with previous German language coursework should determine their preliminary placement by taking Part One of the German placement exam online before coming to campus in August. The placement indicated by the online placement exam is preliminary and should only be used for preregistration purposes this summer. **To confirm their preliminary placement, and/or to receive AP credit in German**, students **must** take Parts Two and Three of the German placement exam on campus during New Student Orientation in late August.

Placement according to the online placement exam result is by level. For preregistration purposes, students should consult the list below to find the course number that corresponds to the level into which they were placed.

Level I: GERM-001 Introductory German I: Contemporary Germany or GERM-011 Intensive Basic German: Contemporary Germany

Level II: GERM-021 Intermediate German I: Experiencing Germany or GERM-032 Intensive Intermediate German: Experiencing Germany

Level III: GERM-101 Advanced German I: Stories & Histories or GERM-111 Intensive Advanced German: Stories & Histories

Level IV: Any Level IV Course (GERM-152-199)

Students with previous modern Greek language coursework should take the departmental placement exam offered during New Student Orientation in August. A rough guide to placement (which should be confirmed by placement exam) is as follows:

0-2 years: GREE 011 Intensive First Level Modern Greek I

3-4 years: GREE 111 Intensive Second Level Modern Greek I

5+ years: GREE 211 Intensive Third Level Modern Greek

SPANISH

Students with no previous Spanish language coursework should register as follows:

(Note: SFS students starting Spanish from the introductory level should consult their dean about the possible paths towards Proficiency.)

All non-beginner students who plan to take fall semester Spanish courses **MUST** take the online summer placement test unless they have taken the SAT II in Spanish (language or literature).

In order to receive Spanish AP credit, students who have not taken the SAT II must take the on-campus proctored confirmation exam during New Student Orientation.

Students who have taken the SAT II may use their scores to confirm AP credit or to place into a class at Georgetown. No further tests are necessary unless the SAT II score is a gross under representation of your current language command.

1. Go to Georgetown University's Blackboard login page at <https://campus.georgetown.edu>.
2. Log in using your NetID and NetID password. **Note:** If you need help with your netID, contact the UIS Service Center at 202-687-4949.
3. After logging in, click the **Courses** link (in the top blue graphic)
4. In the **Course Search** box, type: **placement** and click **Go**
5. Place your mouse over the name of **language placement exam you need to take, click the arrow, and click Enroll.**
6. Confirm your enrollment by clicking the Submit button.
7. Click the **OK** button to enter the placement test site.
8. Follow the instructions on the placement test site to take the test.
 - Make sure that you have a reliable Internet connection. Set aside ample quiet time before you begin the test so that you can complete the test in one sitting; you will not be able to stop and restart the test once launched.
 - Close other programs running on the computer. Avoid distraction; focus only on the test until it is completed.

- To begin the test, click the link only once. It may take some time to load the test: give it at least one minute. If, after clicking once, nothing happens for over a minute, contact The UIS Service Center as soon as possible. Do not click the link multiple times: if you do, you will see a message stating that you have already taken the test and you will not be able to access it again.
- Do not use the Back and Forward buttons on the browser to move around in the test. Use the links and buttons in the test pages to proceed.
- Click the Save button next to each question after answering. Answers are not registered until you click Save. Unsaved answers will be lost if the Internet connection is interrupted or if the browser ceases to respond.
- Do not click the final **Save and Submit** button until you are completely finished with the exam.
- If you encounter a problem or a technical difficulty that prevents you from finishing the test, contact the UIS Service Center as soon as possible.
