EMPLOYMENT BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA

Despite the challenges of searching for employment during the COVID-19 crisis, the class of 2020 found work all over the US and around the world!



EMPLOYMENT DETAILS*

83%

of 2020 MPP graduates were fully employed, 3% were seeking further education and 10% were seeking employment.

86%

of 2020 MPM graduates were fully employed, and 12% were seeking employment.

73%

of 2020 graduates held an internship while completing their degree.

77%

of 2020 MIDP graduates were fully employed and 23% were seeking employment.

75%

of 2020 MS-DSPP graduates were fully employed, 6% were seeking further education, and 12% were seeking employment.

84%

of 2020 graduates found employment within six months of graduation. 97% of 2019 graduates were employed when surveyed six months after graduation.



EMPLOYMENT BY SECTOR

35% of employed 2020 graduates found employment in the public sector, 28% work in the private sector, and 37% work in the non-profit sector.
